

Unsheltered Homeless in US, 2019/2020



Unequal Access to Primary Care

- >80% insured in California
- 15% visited their primary care clinician in last year
- Competing priorities of basic survival needs
- Wait times exceed planning horizon
- Overwhelming barricades to health care



USC Street Medicine- From the Hospital to the Street





Consult Service Goals:

- Prevent Discharge to Street
- Reality Informed Treatment Plan
- Begin Continuity of Care with 1Week Visit Post Discharge

Street Medicine

- Direct delivery of healthcare to the rough sleeping population (unhoused people)
- Care performed wherever patients are
- Distinct from Mobile Medicine
- Connected to the health system
- Done through walking rounds
- Mantra is "Go to the People"











Improved Outcomes for People and Systems





133% Improvement in Follow up Care


